

BRIDGE IN THE BLUEGRASS Harry Gordon, reporting

Down Memory Lane — The passing March 25 of Marge Turnbull, one of our original club members, bestirred a parade of memories. The first duplicate bridge club in Lexington was developed circa 1950 by Mildred "Nat" Bailey and John Harvey. It was located on West Short Street in a building that no longer exists. In the early '60s the club found a new home in the Phoenix Hotel and gained the directing services of the incomparable Faulconer Glass. It was frequented by some of Kentucky's strongest players and most endearing personalities. Regulars included Ben Matthews, who drove in from Shelbyville, and Charlie Bauer, a Louisville mainstay who sported a natty cigarette holder. The 70's ushered in such college kids as Tom Peters (currently a top National player) and Steve Bullard,

who won an "On to the Nationals Open Pairs" with then young local attorney Mel Mills.

In the mid 1970s the hub of Bluegrass duplicate activity transferred to the Bell House, with Friday evening games directed by Betty Wiglesworth at the Newman Center. Though the years Wednesday games were held at the homes of Frances Swinford (now Ban), Charlotte Lander, Arlene Hinkle, Dot Brown (mother of Governor John V. Brown and thought to be KY's first female Life Master), and others including Marge Turnbill. Toddler Susan Swinford (Bullard) sat on the knees of many of these founding lights.

The most gracious player of that era was Marge Turnbull, a true Southern lady, who never had a bad word to say about anyone. She was a skilled player to the end and will be sorely missed.
