West led the ten of hearts. Dick won this trick with the ace of hearts from dummy to retain the king of hearts for transportation to his hand. Dick's first task was to draw trumps. He led the jack of spades winning the trick with the ace from

his hand and led the three of clubs. West won with the ace and returned his last heart. Dick won with the king in his hand and returned a small spade to dummy's ten. He played dummy's king of clubs, followed by the ace of diamonds. He led the nine of spades from dummy winning, which was followed by the eight of spades overtaken in his hand. He then played a fifth round of spades leaving this three card ending position:

Dick then played the two of spades and both East and West were caught in a double squeeze. At our table the opponents were in a quiet four spades game making five for a plus 13 IMP swing and a KO victory for the Ellis team. With declarer play like this I am surprised that he wasn't a Diamond Life Master ten years ago.

Also, conduct that is especially outstanding or refreshment should be reported also.

COMMENDABLE

- Being a good "host" or "guest" at the table.
- Greeting others in a friendly manner.
- Praising the bidding and/or play of an opponent.
- Having two clearly completed convention cards readily available to the opponents. (This is a regulation not a nicety.)

UNACCEPTABLE

- Badgering, rudeness, insinuations, intimidation, profanity, threats or violence.
- Negative comments concerning opponents' or partner's play or bidding.
- Gloating over good results. Constant and gratuitous lessons and analyses at the table. Loud and disruptive arguing with a tournament director.

If you experience someone exhibiting discourteous behavior or being other than civil, please call a tournament director immediately. If you feel that there was a very serious breach of discipline, in
