As those of you who worked on the Louisville NABC in 2011 know, putting on this tournament is a LOT of work for all of us in the District to do it right, but as Louisville proved, we sure know how to do it. Most of the burden will fall on Unit 122 but we should all stand ready to help. I am so proud that the NABC is coming to our District only nine years after the last visit . . .

ACBLScore Report

The highly anticipated report of the Management Technology Committee formed in Providence was delivered in a public forum, including a Q and A, on March 12th. The session was videoed and is available for viewing at https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=m9fat48MDR8. I urge all of you who are technically inclined or have been following this controversy on Bridgewinners to watch it. It lasted for nearly two hours and does a far better job than I possibly could of covering the technical aspects of this complex issue. But here are some basic takeaways:

- -- The termination of the ACBLScore+ project was the correct decision.
- --ACBLScore, though a fantastic piece of software, has, after thirty years, reached the end of its useful life and will be phased out, probably over the next eighteen months or so.
- --Capital technology expenditures from this point forward should and will be made on "modular" applications that can be used now and then transferred to to any underlying system we develop or choose. This is like loading apps to to your Smartphone and then buying a new phone ... you can plug your apps into whatever new platform you choose.
 - --Every effort is being made to salvage everything we can from the

ACBLScore+ project (we own it, after all,) as part of the "mobility" apps plan.

--The Committee was very enthused about going forward. They promise to keep everyone updated as they work to find the right platform while continuing to add great new features to Score.

I was deeply impressed with the three "outside members" —Greg Humphreys, Uday Ivatury and Ralph Lipe who, among them, have worked extensively with Google, Microsoft and BBO—and their balanced analysis. I hope you will be as well.

CELEBRATING JEFF

On the first Saturday of the tournament, we gathered with Jeff Johnston's family, friends and colleagues to remember his life and its impact on us. Those of you who worked closely with Jeff on the Louisville NABC know there was no kinder, calmer more efficient event organizer in the world. He had already put a great deal of effort into the selection of Columbus and he will be sorely missed, both then and at every NABC to come. His absence was deeply felt here in NOLA and it was an honor to meet his family let them know how much he meant to us.

SIDE GAME AWARDS

Events that do not qualify for championship rating by exceeding the number permitted or by being the same as another event that session (side games) are subject to the "M" factor appropriate to the event, with the "M" factor limited to 80%. [Raised from 65%] Side games at NABCs are the same as side games at Regionals.

Please note that awards for side game series are unaffected.

ADVANCES ON STRATEGIC PROJECTS

The Board received reports on three projects that grew out of our Strategic Plan and I hope you'll be as wowed as I was. First, we heard from Dan Plato, the newly appointed Manager of Recruiting and Development on the TDU (Tournament Director University) PILOT PROGRAM. In far more detail than I can go into here, Dan described the selection of five newer TDs in September 2014 with the goal of getting all five "DIC ready" by April of this year. They have received training and mentoring; they have been tasked with answering the eighteen hundred questions a year that come into ACBL on rulings—they work on their answers and submit them to Dan for review; they have been charged with entering every single tournament into TourneyTrax in order to understand those regulations and laws of tournament events; they have been sent all over the country for their training and the feedback from both mentors and mentees has been incredibly positive. The five are indeed now ready to roll! In addition, a two hundred plus page handbook for TDs has been compiled as a single point of reference. Continued work on the handbook and a rollout of the program with tools to implement and track progress are underway. Sylvia Hardin, who has been redeployed from Director of Human Resources to Senior Director of Field Operations, has overall responsibility for TDU and has been working with our current staff of TDs and Field Supervisors on Customer Service Training (a HUGE demand from constituents) and core skills.

Three of our eight supervisors are retiring; we need not only to replace them but are restructuring to have twelve FS positions and four new positions of Field Supervisors over them . . . veteran TDs Sol Weinstein and Nancy Boyd have already been promoted to two of these new slots; and, as a compliment to Dan's for recruitment and training will be a new position for a Manager for Quality and Continuous Improvement. After the expected initial skepticism, TDs have reacted with enthusiasm for their new training and opportunities and Sylvia and Dan are confident that our drive to improve our TD services and plan for the staffing needs of the future.

Brian Delfs, our Education Program Manager reported that our online *LEARN TO PLAY BRIDGE* application is the number one hit on Google for "learn bridge" and "learn bridge online." Even those of you who don't consider yourselves "techies" can see what a fantastic achievement that is! http://learn.acbl.org/

As you read in the March Bulletin, the ACBL ONLINE PARTNERSHIP DESK is now live. Chris van Leeuwen is the staff member in charge and reported that going into NOLA we have already had over ten thousand hits and 1675 profiles have been created. Chris was delighted to now have answers for the many members who call her because, for any number of reasons, they can't find partners at local clubs or while traveling. When one man called her from Memphis wanting to know how to find a partner, her only solution was to ask "what are you doing Sunday night?" ©

KO AWARDS

At non-NABC Events, players on KO teams with more than four players who are otherwise eligible for overall awards will be subject to the following participation reduction:

For every segment (half a match) of a match that is won and where a participant sits out, the overall awards for that individual will be reduced by 5%. For example, if a player's team wins a four-session KO and that participant played only half of each match, that player's masterpoint award will be reduced by 20%.

MARKETING

The ACBL is in the process of contracting with a new service to allow clubs, units and districts greater direct control over the email blasts that go out to members. Watch for your Marketing Newsletter for details.

CONVENTION CHART CHANGES

The General Convention Chart was amended to allow:

TRANSFER RESPONSES (responses after overcalls) where the call shows length or values in the suit of the transfer; and,

A DEFENSE to a natural notrump bid or overcall of a direct overcall of two diamonds to show a one-suited hand in hearts or spades.

GNT GRASS ROOTS

On the third try in four years, a motion to make entries for the GNTs at NABCs free finally passed. As you know, I have consistently opposed this motion based on lack of funding (as opposed to the NAPs which collect funds all summer long in the qualifiers) and opposed it this time as well on the basis that we created the Grass Roots fund to allow Districts to allocate funds how they wished to these events. The vote has always been close and was this time as well. Free entries apply only to the first two days and ONLY to Flights A, B and C... NOT the Championship Flight. But that's not the end of the story. Immediately following the passing of the above motion, we were presented with a motion to "tax" the Grass Roots fund twenty percent at the ACBL level and use that twenty percent to redistribute the funds raised based on a complex formula that, in essence, rewards those Districts that raise the most per member and account for size. But an amendment was proposed to this motion to require that, before any such that before the adjustment is made, the amount required to fund the free entries (around \$16K) be debited from the Grass Roots Fund.

One would think that this amendment would lose by the same margin that the first motion won, but it passed, quickly followed by the passing of the entire second motion.

So now, the funding of free entries for A, B and C is coming directly out of the Grass Roots Fund and whatever is left can be used by the Districts as they choose. Stay tuned.

DISCIPLINE

The publication rules were clarified to provide that, in findings of guilt, all disciplines will be published on the website for the length of time of the discipline levied. Expulsions shall also be reported in the ACBL Bulletin.

This applies to any decisions of a Unit, District or ACBL level disciplinary committee, and of the Ethical Oversight Committee. It shall also apply to decisions made at clubs regarding ethical violations when the ACBL is made aware of the decision, but does not apply to decisions made by a club disciplinary procedure regarding non-ethical violations.

FINANCE

The Operating Budget approved for 2015 projects an excess of revenues over expenditures of \$9461. The Capital Budget was significantly reduced from the \$600K number tentatively approved in November to \$270,170. Much of the reduction is a reflection of the change in approach recommended by the Board Technology Committee and affirmed by the outside Tech Comm discussed above to budget only for "mobile apps" achievable in the short-term and transferable to a long-term platform. Short-term in this case is around six months so there may well be additional capital expenditures approved later in the year.







UR MOST EXCITING news this month is that Columbus has been awarded the Spring 2020 NABC! It'll be great to have our city showcased at a National. Thanks to Jim Bachelder and Cheryl Schneider who worked so hard to make this happen. When the time comes, we'll be needing lots of volunteers. Answer your phone!

New Life Masters this issue are Nanci Heller, Joyce Ades, Marilyn Wolfe and Thomas McDow. That brings our total for the year up to fourteen! Joyce Ades also made Bronze, along with Bill Patch and Yvonne McNabb. New Silver Life Masters are Sandy Simpson and Walt Wagner. Congratulations to all.

A Platinum Life Master is defined by the ACBL as a Life Master with (a) over 10,000 masterpoints, including (b) no fewer than 100 platinum points, (c) no fewer than a combination of 750 gold or platinum points, and (d) no fewer than a combination of 2000 silver, red, gold or platinum points. I was privileged to be playing at the Columbus Bridge Center when Ken Eichenbaum achieved Platinum status. Ken began toying with bridge under the influence of his father way back in high school, but it wasn't until he moved to Los Angeles in 1971 that bridge became the focal point of his life. He is particularly proud of the two bridge plays that he wrote. "The Wizard of Odds" was first performed in 1978 at a national tournament held in Cincinnati. It was later performed in Lexington Kentucky, Columbus Ohio and Los Angeles California. His second play, "Annie, Count Your Trumps" was written in 1984 and performed at bridge week in Pasadena, California. Perhaps it's time to resurrect those plays! Ken has written several bridge books, taught many classes, and given lectures about this marvelous game that he loves. Nothing gives him greater pleasure than to see someone's eyes light up when they have grasped a new concept or tells him about some success they have had because of his tutelage. He would rather be remembered as a great teacher than as a great player.

Some of Ken's greatest achievements:

- 1. In the late 1970's, he won a bridge bet for \$1.00 from Eric Rodwell. They were playing at the Clintonville bridge club on a Friday evening. Ken was playing with Bob Traver, and Eric was playing with Jeff Meckstroth. To this day, Eric maintains that it is the only bridge bet he ever lost.
- 2. In the later 1980's, Ken won the inaugural state pairs championship,

partnered with Walter Johnson. He also was on the winning team in the inaugural state championship, playing with Harry Stratton. Walter was not on their team, so Ken is the only one to win the Ohio state championship in the first pairs AND team events.

- 3. Between 1983 and 1986, he lived in Los Angeles. While out there, he was the leading masterpoint winner at a regional in Fresno. This was especially sweet for several reasons. First, he only played in three events, winning each event with different partners. Second, He beat out Grant Baze for most masterpoints at the tournament, even though Grant played in FIVE events!
- 4. His fondest memory is winning a regionally rated pairs event with his father at a national tournament.

Nicknames often have special meanings. During Ken's bridge career, he has been honored with three of them. In the early 70's, he had the privilege of playing with Jimmy Wisemiller, at the time a great player. He wanted to find out how well Ken played. Although they ended up winning the event, when asked how Ken played, Jimmy's response was "he plays a good game of 'firehouse pinochle.'" The nickname "Firehouse" stuck for a long time. Paddi Cline (bless her soul) to her dying day never called him anything else. Bob Brandow still calls him "Firehouse" and may not even know his real name!

Ken met Bob Hamman at the Albuqurque nationals around 1981. During a pairs event at that tournament, they both played the same hand, five spades doubled, via the same auction and with the same opening lead. Ken made the contract and Bob went down. When Ken told Bob how he had played the hand, Bob tipped his imaginary hat and said "well done, Professor." Since then, whenever they see each other, Mr. Hamman refers to Ken as "Professor."

While living in Los Angeles, Ken's friends, Ifti Baqai and Mitch Dunnitz, two expert players in their own right, affectionately nicknamed him "Maestro."

He has met so many people and made so many friends along the way, and is eternally grateful to all of them. Congratulations, Ken, on a marvelous achievement.

There is one more member of our Unit to be brought to your attention. Curmudgeon. Skeptic. Contrarian. Put such labels on Kevin Cadmus and he will thank you profusely! Kevin is a dabbler in new and perhaps foreign ideas in bridge bidding. He is never satisfied with explanations or arguments, such as:

- Bidding is taught this way by excellent bridge teachers
- You'll find more partners if you use the XYZ bidding system
- Using XYZ is commonly accepted practice by good players

With his mathematical background, Kevin demands proof, or at least carefully collected statistical evidence. Anecdotal reports are woefully insufficient. For example, do you think using weak two-bids helps to improve your scores? Prove it!! He remains skeptical.

One of his earlier bridge bidding systems was called *Alien*. It was based on the following thought experiment. What if we send only the *Laws of Duplicate Bridge* to some advanced alien civilization? This transmission is not to include any conventions, restrictions or simulations to test ideas as they pop into their multiple heads. Kevin, the curmudgeonly skeptical contrarian cannot imagine that they would come up with five-card majors, weak two-bids, Drury or Gerber. Surely these relics are accidents of the earthly historical development of the game, rather than being foregone conclusions derivable from the rules!

His latest invention is the *BFUN* bidding system. *BFUN* is short for "Bridge for the Unbalanced." This system begins with the use of canapé style bidding of two-suited unbalanced hands. *BFUN* includes strong artificial one club and weak one notrump opening bids. It includes many new ideas and conventions, while dumping several of Kevin's least favorite conventions. The result is now published in his book, *BFUN*: *Bridge for the Unbalanced*, now available from Amazon. Those courageous players at the Columbus Bridge Center who have learned and used *BFUN*, have found it to be fun indeed. (PS: I'm one of those players!)



Solutions for "Can Cincinnatians Do Better?"

Solution Problem #1 - 3NT(S). Opening lead: ♥4

We have seven top tricks: two ♠s, one ♦ and four ♠s. If the ♦K is onside we will make an overtrick. What if the finesse fails? We will have enough tricks unless opponents will establish five (or more) tricks for the defense.


Apparently W holding weak hand has decided to find partner's suit. Now, if we play $\mathbf{V}Q$ (or $\mathbf{V}J$) at trick one, E can win and knock out our last \mathbf{V} honor. Defense will get one \mathbf{V} and four \mathbf{V} s. (We cannot even endplay E because of transportation problems). Fortunately, we have simple safety play here: small heart at trick one. Defense cannot get more than four tricks now - three \mathbf{V} s and one \mathbf{V} .

However, if diamond hook doesn't work, defense will continue hearts and we will go down. The finesse will succeed 50% of the time. We can improve our chances by winning first trick in dummy and playing small club.

- 1. Defense could duck ♠K. Now we can shift gears and get five ♦ tricks in addition to one ♠, one ♠ and two ♥s.
- If E will play ♠A and clear hearts, we can check clubs before hooking ♠K and, if ♠s are three-three, we will get one ♠, two ♥s, one ♠, and five ♠s.
- 3. If W will win ♠A and clear ♥s, we should hope for the ♦ finesse. ♀

It is a huge challenge since facilities that fill all those requirements normally don't even want to talk to a group unless the group plans also to do several catered events (breakfasts, banquets,

We are hopeful that we will be able to offer a great site in 2016-one that will bring more guests to our regional. We'll let you know as soon as we have signed a contract.



ATHY AND RAY Linck - Gold Life Masters "By our estimation, seventy to eighty percent of the club members helped us achieve our Gold Life Masters," stated Ray Linck. They are referring to the 70-80% as teammates in team games, not partners. Ray and Kathy have had a solid partnership since they met in Washington, D.C. as college interns working for the Federal government. The only times they have not played together are the Mentor/ Mentee games and a brief period of time after Kathy had surgery and could not play.

They were each introduced to the game of bridge at the "knees of their parents" in the 50's. They began playing "Rubber Bridge" with their parents and when the two met it was a cheap form of entertainment and a great outlet for their competitive nature.

In 1970 they joined a new-comer's club in Wycoff, New Jersey, bought a set of duplicate boards and learned the game of Duplicate Bridge. They brought their duplicate boards with them in 1973 when IBM moved Ray to Lexington as a Systems Analyst. While raising their children Kathy got involved in the PTA where she became President of the Fayette County PTA Council and served four years on the Kentucky State PTA Board as the Bylaws Chairman. Throughout this busy time in their lives they still made time for bridge. They used their duplicate boards when playing in homes around town where they met Judy and Norm Johnson, Kristi and Alan Karow, Kelly Butler and Reva Brehm.

They joined ACBL in 1999 when they both retired and have been very active in the Lexington Bridge Club and Unit 164 ever since. They both became Directors in 2005 in a three-day class at the Orlando, Florida NABC. Ray served on the Unit 164 Board for nine years. Kathy is currently the Secretary and the By-laws Committee Chair of Unit 164. She previously served 4 years as the Lexington Bridge Club's Secretary. 

It covers Opening Leads against No Trump and Suit Contracts, Third-Hand Play, Second Hand Play, Defensive Signals, Developing Defensive Tricks, Interfering with the Declarer, Making a Defense Plan and Negative Doubles.

Recipe:

At a recent Evansville Duplicate Bridge Club pitch in, Kay Fuchs brought a fabulous sweet potato casserole.

She has graciously shared her recipe.

Sweet Potato Casserole:

2 lbs sweet potatoes, peeled and cut

½ cup granulated sugar

½ cup milk

1/4 cup melted butter

3 large eggs, beaten

2-3 tsp grated orange peel

1 tsp. vanilla

Topping

½ cup brown sugar, packed

1/3 cup flour

1/4 cup butter

1/2 cup chopped pecans

Bring sweet potatoes to a boil, reduce heat and simmer covered, 12-15 minutes until tender. Drain potatoes and mash until smooth. Stir in sugar, milk, butter, eggs, orange peel and vanilla. Spoon into a 9" square pan. Combine brown sugar and flour in a bowl, and then cut in butter until crumbly. Toss with nuts and sprinkle over potatoes. Bake for 30 minutes at 350 degrees. If recipe is doubled, bake in 13"x9" dish for 40 minutes.




Finally, Ray Andersen, recently shared some tips on becoming a life master. There are fifteen total suggestions. This issue features four:

- 2. Develop other partners to play with in team games (Swiss Teams and Knock Outs) who want to become life masters and are willing to travel with you to area sectional and regional tournaments. Regional tournaments now offer Gold Rush Pairs and Gold Rush Swiss Team events which give players additional opportunities to earn gold points.
- 3. Make sure that your partner and your team members are fun and friendly not only to play with but to be with as you pursue your goals.
- 4. DON'T GET DISCOURAGED! You won't get points every time you play in a tournament. But hopefully, you will have fun being with friends and will have learned from your mistakes in the process.


