



reetings from the Louisville Bridge Club. We've had many exciting changes in the last quarter.

We are thrilled to share that the Louisville Bridge Club has a new home. The lease at our former club was due to expire, and several bridge club members began a thorough, and at times exhausting, search for a location that would satisfy our member needs: we sought an updated space, one that was located near main roads, a size big enough to host our sectional tournaments on site, with food options nearby.

The final choice was made for a location at 9870 Linn Station Road in Louisville. We were able to lease what were two separate units, knocking down walls and updating the site down to the bare studs. The committee had to take into account multiple needs presented by club members including lighting, accessibility, supplies, a separate training room for classes and events, even a coat rack area large enough to accommodate winter attire. A sub-team formed to select the design elements: tile, carpeting, cabinets, counter tops, lighting, paint (....who knew there are really that many different shades of blue.....). The entire construction process took several months to complete.

The new club opened for game play on Monday April 18, after closing the former club for only two days to move the equipment and set-up the tables and kitchen. On Saturday May 21, we celebrated our Grand Opening with an Open House. We held afternoon and evening games, with brunch provided by our social committee and dinner provided by local restaurants. Louisville mayor, Greg Fischer, proclaimed the day to be "Louisville Bridge Association Day."

The new location is well put-together and a very welcoming playing space. We are thankful and proud of all of the club members, all volunteers, who contributed to our successful project. WOW! We've attached pictures so you can see why we are so excited.






### Gerald Steuernagle Award 2016 - Helen Ogle





### Sue Bullard Unit 164's New Diamond Life Master

UE BULLARD JOINED the elite group of three Diamond Life Masters in the Lexington Bridge Club and Unit 164 going over the five thousand masterpoints milestone playing with her long-time partner, Harry Gordon at the April Gatlinburg Regional tournament.

Sue is a life-long Lexingtonian. The daughter of Frances Keller Barr, who was instrumental in peaking Sue's early interest in the game of bridge. Sue would watch the games that her mother hosted in their home and was fascinated.

She started caddying for the duplicate tournaments in Lexington well before she started playing herself. "They paid the caddies five dollars per session," she explained. "That was a lot of money for a kid back then!"

Sue began learning and playing bridge in high school. She played a little duplicate in college at the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill, NC. She graduated with a B.A. in Communications preparing her for a career as an



Insurance Claims Adjustor. It wasn't until she returned to Lexington after finishing her college education that she became serious about duplicate bridge.

At that time duplicate games were played at the Bell House. Early on she played a few times with her brother, Billy Swinford. Her mother, Frances, was another early partner and her first mentor. There were also two of Frances' friends who were "willing" to play with Sue-Kathleen Ramsey and Dorothy Brown (the mother of John Y. Brown, Jr.-the governor of Kentucky). "Dorothy Brown was probably the first female Life Master in the state of Kentucky," said Sue. "I was thrilled to play with her!"

Another major influence in Sue's bridge career was her late husband, Steve Bullard. "He was a very good bridge player," she said. "When I returned from college my junior year, I played against him."

Her skills at the bridge table must have impressed him because he asked her to partner with him on a Swiss teams game at the 1977 Pine Mountain Little Brown Jug tournament. Sue and Steve, along with teammates Dennis Hesthaven and D. L. Proctor, won the Swiss Teams event—her first event win!

The year 1978 proved to be a big year for Sue. "I was really lucky at the Lexington Regional that year," she stated. The regional was held at the convention center downtown. At the same time, a rodeo was going on in the same venue – nicknaming the bridge tournament the "Rodeo Regional"—largely because of the horse smell that permeated the room where the tournament was held.

Sue came in second place in a Women's Pairs event playing with her mother. She also came in second place in the Master's Pairs event playing with Steve Bullard. On Sunday of the "Rodeo Regional" she and Steve played with Nancy and Harry Gordon in the Sunday Swiss Teams event and came in the overall.

"I got all my gold in this one tournament and I had less than one hundred masterpoints!" exclaimed Sue. It remains one of her most memorable highlights of her bridge career.

Another highlight occurred in the early 1980's. The Grand National Teams event was structured differently than it is today. Back then there was a local qualifying tournament in Lexington. The winning ream would then go to a state-qualifying tournament in Louisville, and then thirty-two teams would compete at the District level with winners advancing to the National level.

By this time, Sue and Steve had married. They were on a five-man team from Lexington with Nancy and Harry Gordon and Art Moore. The team made it through to the thirty-two team District level and were seeded 16th or 17th. Friday (the first day of the event) was a qualifying Knockout. They won! On Saturday—due to the seeding (16th or 17th) they had to play the number one seeded team of Jeff Meckstroth, Eric Rodwell and their teammates!

From that day forth Harry was known as the "Hideous Hog," a character from Victor Mollo's "Bridge in the Menagerie" series. "We just thought it was appropriate for Harry," Sue explained.

The team was defeated soundly and Sue declared, "I will NEVER, EVER play with Harry Gordon again!!"

Never say never. Since 1992, Harry has been Sue's favorite and consistent partner. Their partnership has been so successful that both have earned the distinction of Diamond Life Master.

The most recent highlight Sue recalled was going to the 2009 Washington DC NABC with Sandra and Mike Marlin, representing District 11 in the Grand National Teams event. "It was so much fun!" Sue said.

When asked what advice she would give novice bridge players interested in improving their game she said:

"When you are learning—concentrate on the play of the hand and defense. You should not cloud you mind with a lot of systems. Learn the basics and master them. Play a simple card and good defense."

This is great advice from an excellent bridge player and someone who has mentored many new players, myself included. Thank you, Sue! Congratulations on this fabulous achievement!

### 2016 Lexington Spring Sectional

The 2016 Lexington Spring Sectional tournament held at the Clarion Suites and Convention Center had a twelve percent growth in attendance over the same tournament a year ago. There were a total of 219 tables over the three-day sectional. 880.3 silver masterpoints were earned by 207 bridge players.




