I ALL! THE ACBL has had an eventful year so far, and I'm honored to be your voice on the ACBL Board. It's customary at this point to thank outgoing Board members for their service, but Beth Reid makes it easy. Beth, you certainly leave the ACBL in a far better place than when you began your first term, and though you cannot be replaced, I'm humbled by the prospect of succeeding you. On behalf of the entire District membership, we owe you our deepest thanks.

This is my first report as "District Director," a terribly unfortunate label. I've already been asked a variety of questions about penalty cards and leads out of turn. We've got Unit Board "Directors," District Board "Directors," ACBL Board "Directors," and, of course, the spectrum of game directors (National Tournament Directors, Associate Tournament Directors, Club Directors, etc.). I'm going to try to use the term "ACBL Board Member" in my communication to you, but let me know if you think the "District Director" label works better.

For that matter, I'd love to hear from you about what kind of news from the ACBL Board you'd like to hear about. The Board takes on a LOT of responsibility (too much, in my opinion), so there's much to report. I want to keep these newsletters focused on decisions that matter most to our players and maintain a reasonable length. If there are topics of particular interest to you, let me know. I'll try to work something in. Of course, I will continue to give shout outs to wins and high level finishes at NABCs by players from our District.

Help Wanted

As you may be aware, the big news of the year has been the resignation of ACBL CEO, Robert Hartman, effective July 31, 2017. I never had a chance to work closely with Robert, but the Board of Directors appeared to regard him quite highly. A CEO search committee has made significant progress, and interviews are underway. We hope to have a decision in the near future, and hopefully by the time of the Toronto NABC.

In related news, the ACBL has hired Dan Storch, formerly of Lexington, KY, to be our Chief Marketing Officer. Other important positions, such as National Recorder and several Field Supervisor positions, remain unfilled.

"Stop" No More?

At the recommendation of the Competitions & Conventions Committee, the Board was prepared to get rid of the dreaded "Stop" card. Most people felt that the card was used inconsistently, and quite often for inappropriate purposes (i.e., to alert one's partner that they are making a skip bid). Note that this would NOT change the requirement to wait ten seconds after an opposing player's skip

bid (which is in effect whether the Stop card is used or not. However, the C&C Committee wanted to give opposing voices one last chance to be heard, so the motion was deferred until Toronto (17-7-1). Go ahead and use the "Stop" card for now, but be prepared for a change later this year.



Kansas City NABC

Kansas City proved to be an outstanding site for the 2017 Spring NABC, which made it all the more disappointing that attendance was lighter than expected. The host hotels were a bit of a walk apart, but connected by a convenient sky bridge.

As you might expect, the barbecue was outstanding, and the weather was forgiving for those of us who preferred to walk rather than use Kansas City's excellent public transportation. The playing areas were spacious, lighting was good, and bathrooms were convenient.

Next up on the NABC schedule is the Toronto, which takes place July 20-30. People have complained about the lack of hotel rooms, and their prices, but there are options (AirBnB, local area hotels) if you look. With the US dollar valued so highly against the Canadian dollar right now, you're getting your housing at about a 30% discount. Hope to see you there!

Notable Finishes in KC

Congrats to Pamela Granovetter, who (with Sylvia Shi) (pictured at lower right) won the Smith Life Master Women's Pairs! This is her second win in the event (2015) and her 8th National Championship title, by my count.

Also, kudos go to Ellen Kozlove and Ralph Letizia, who (with Lee Bukstel and Michael Wolf) took second place in the 10K Swiss Teams, an event they won back in 2013. They placed just behind a team captained by some random former software developer from Seattle (Google "ACBL 2017 Kansas City 10K Swiss" if you're curious).

Our North American Pairs (NAP) representatives struggled in Kansas City. Our top finish was Reeta Brendamour and J.D. Kurtzman, who finished 10th in Flight C. Last year's Flight B runner up, Mike Ma and Steve Moese, placed 11th in Flight B, with Don and Paula Byrkett just behind them in 12th place.

ACBL Board Meeting Expenses

Although this was my first formal meeting, I was impressed by the efforts taken by the ACBL Board to reduce their expenses over the past few years. They have obviously heard the grass roots backlash against the ACBLScore debacle, and they have reduced meeting costs in a number of areas. However, challenges still

remain, and I am disappointed that a second motion to move the Fall meetings of the Board to ACBL Headquarters in Horn Lake failed (7-18-0). Beth Reid worked very hard to rally support for this motion during her final meeting in Orlando last fall, but old habits die hard, and the Board decided to continue meeting at the location of the Fall NABC. As you might guess, I voted in favor of the motion. A companion motion to move the ACBL Board's Fall meeting in 2018 away from the Honolulu NABC location also failed (8-17-0). I voted in favor of this motion as well.

Although I believe it reflects poorly on the Board to have made these decisions, I do understand the position of those Board members who feel it is important to have our meetings at the NABCs. Other high level committee meetings are held at the NABCs, which many of our Board must attend in any event. Our NABCs are terrific opportunities to get personal feedback from our players. And yes, we also like to play bridge when we have a chance, so combining our meetings with NABCs makes some logistical sense.

Our current President, Bob Heller, has changed our meeting schedule at the Summer NABC so that we overlap with the first Friday-Saturday game schedule. This saves quite a bit of money. Spouses of Board members no longer have early-week excursions paid for, and our financial powers-that-be run a tight ship when it comes to Board expenses.

Entry Pricing for KO Teams

Last year, the pricing for KO events at NABCs was changed for teams of more than four players, and now the ACBL charges per player, not per team, in these events. This change had strong advocates on either side, and a motion to reconsider the change failed (3-22-0). I voted against reconsideration, for several reasons. First, so long as each player on the team receives the full masterpoint award, it seems reasonable to charge a full entry fee. Second, entry fees are used to cover a wide variety of costs, and many of these costs should be calculated per player. Late night hospitality snacks are not consumed per team, but per player. All players on a team use supplies, read the Daily Bulletin, receive a registration packet and win prizes. Finally, I have a strong preference for deciding issues and then moving on to other questions, instead of re-litigating the same old thing meeting after meeting. Even when I find myself on the losing side of a vote, I will rarely, if ever, vote to reconsider an item unless I believe it necessary to correct a grave injustice.

Two final notes on this question: first, this pricing structure applies only to KO team events at NABCs; the pricing of Regional and Sectional events is at

ERE IS A hand from the just-completed Spring nationals in Kansas City.

North was Tor Helness and South was Geir Helgemo, the two

great Norwegians. They are possibly the best pair in the world. I have told everyone for years, if you make it to the NABCs and want to kibbitz, watch this pair. They play natural methods, so you can understand their bidding. What you will see is beautiful, well-judged auctions and impeccable card play. Watch Helgemo make this impossible hand.

The auction is straightforward, no one can take issue with any bid made. After West leads a spade, declarer could see two trump losers and must therefore bring the Clubs in with no losers. A finesse and a 3/2 split. Not very promising, but Helgemo saw some chance to improve on that.

He first ruffed the Spade, crossed to the Heart Q and ruffed the last Spade

and eliminated the Hearts. When all followed he led a Club to the Ace and then led the Diamond Q. East won and had nothing but black cards, so he chose to get out with a Spade. Declarer discarded a club from hand trumped the Spade in the dummy. He then cashed the king of Clubs. Now he led another trump and West was forced to win and give him a Ruff-sluff!

He discarded his remaining Club from hand and ruffed in dummy and claimed!

He made the hand with both Clubs offside, but the really unique thing about this hand is, he end played both opponents on the same hand! I'm not sure I have ever seen that. East was said to have left the table muttering, if you had only led a low trump.

the discretion of the Sponsoring Organization. Second, many of you know how I feel about a District-wide policy on this question: I believe in local control of our tournaments to the greatest extent possible and thus have advocated against a District-wide policy.

NAP Subsidies

A motion to subsidize the 3rd and 4th place finishers (\$200 and \$100, respectively) in each District for the North American Pairs failed (11-13-1). I voted in favor of this motion, as the ACBL makes a lot of money from the NAP (mostly from the NAP club qualifying games), and I think the ACBL should use the opportunity to give something to everyone in this event.

Regional-Plus Events

A motion to increase the masterpoint payouts by approximately 15% for Regional events held at NABCs passed (14-9-2). I voted in favor of this motion, as it provides a small incentive to attend NABCs in lieu of other nearby Regionals. Some Regional events held at NABCs also have a significantly stronger field. The two-session Sunday Swiss held before the Vanderbilt and Spingold starts, for example, has been nicknamed the "Rockcrusher" or "Vice Grip" Swiss. In Kansas City, the only National events held on Sunday were the finals of the Platinum Pairs (twenty pairs), and the Senior Pairs. Everyone else, including most of the Vanderbilt teams, played in that event. Just brutal.

Personal Thoughts

Much of the work of the ACBL Board is done through Committees. Unquestionably, our individual perspectives are framed by our work and our experience on these Committees. Beth was a critical member of the Finance Committee for much of her service on the Board, and you therefore heard a lot about the ACBL's finances. I will provide considerably less detail on the ACBL budget, as I have been assigned to other Committees that fit my skill set better. I have been assigned to the Appeals and Charges Committee, which functions as the "Supreme Court" of sorts for all manner of different disciplinary cases. By rule, these proceedings are confidential, so I can't share details of these cases with you. Trust me, based on my experience so far, you wouldn't be interested.

I have also been assigned to the Strategic Committee, which I have high hopes as a mechanism for change. So far, my experience has been lukewarm, but I am not giving up. I believe you elected me based, in part, on the issues I campaigned on and believed were important: (1) a closer attention to the needs of our clubs, teachers, and other grass roots constituents; (2) a more closely defined relationship between management and the Board; and (3) an urgent need to address the aging demographics of our membership. I'm quite surprised at how much resistance I've encountered inside the Board of Directors to the idea of expanding the ACBL's Youth Bridge outreach. Much of the Board seems content to focus on recent retirees and serving the needs of our current membership. As you know, I am convinced the ACBL needs to reverse course and begin reducing the average age of our membership (currently seventy-one, and climbing). It seems so clear to me that the long-term health of bridge in North America is tied to our youth, and I'm going to keep banging that drum. I'm cautiously optimistic that the newly-freed ACBL Education Foundation will become put its energy into youth-centered efforts.

I will continue to serve as the District's Tournament Coordinator for the time being, and I still direct games at the Cincinnati Bridge Center and teach six to seven bridge classes each week. You'll also see me at our local Regionals when my schedule allows me time to play, and I am always available by phone (513-313-0488) or e-mail (AJStephani@gmail.com) with questions or concerns.





We booked an ABC Charters flight to Havana from Miami. As it turned out, American Airlines began to fly to Havana a week before our flight, so our "charter" was the regularly scheduled American Airlines flight. The flight cost \$197, and we used miles to get to and from Miami. The cost of the Festival was \$1290/ person for four nights at the Melia Cohiba, Havana, five nights at the allinclusive beach resort Sol Palmeras in Varadero, airport welcome and transfers, two dinners, all breakfasts, a Havana nightclub show, and Havana



city tour. The daily bridge games - four pairs and five teams - cost \$215. We paid in cash upon arrival. It's still difficult to use credit cards.



The Festival was held under the auspices of the World Bridge Federation's (WBF) Central American and Caribbean Bridge Federation. There were over 50 players from Canada, Norway, Cuba, Spain, Costa Rica, Trinidad, the Netherlands, Lithuania, Brazil, Argentina, and the US(CO, NY, KY, NC, and CA). Not all players played in both the pairs and teams sessions. A Canadian couple, our first opponents, told us to leave our convention cards in our room and "have fun." We certainly had fun, but noted a very wide range of player ability. We were told that Diego Brenner played on the Italian team and that Jacek Pszcola and Justin Lall were world ranked. In addition, Dave Caprera (playing with wife Anne Brenner) coaches the US Junior Team, on which Isaac Stephani played. For the team games, we were assigned players from Argentina and Spain. All of the players were gracious and willing to offer helpful advice.

The young Cuban players (pictured above right) were a delight. A self-taught older gentleman had given them bridge lessons and they played in their homes. They are holding the ACBL decks that I gave them. I wish we could sponsor four of them to attend the Flying Pig regional. Bridge is allowed in Cuba because Fidel Castro's sister Emma played bridge. She convinced Fidel that playing



bridge is like playing chess - not like gambling, which he hated. Emma played in an earlier Cuba Festival and some of the players we met remembered her.

Of course, there are challenges playing in a country where one does not speak the language. I insisted that there was a malfunction in my BridgeMate. When I entered four hearts, I saw 4C on the display screen. The kindly director told me there was no malfunction since heart in Spanish - corazon - does begin with a C!!!! (; and exclamation points begin and end the sentence!)

Some things I learned include the following:

- The WBF's Continuous VP (logarithmic) Scale which we used was also used at the recent Orlando Nationals and will soon be featured in our regionals. Flying Pig? [tm: Not yet, but D11 does use this scale for the D11 GNT District Finals]
- The WBF is divided into eight geographic zones. The website (www. worldbridge.org) is certainly worth a look if you are traveling and want to attend a bridge festival. For example, there is one in the Canary Islands from March 26-April 1 and a seven day Caribbean cruise from Havana and five night allinclusive Cuba beach resort from May 20-31.
- Some ACBL understandings may not be shared by the WBF and its affiliates. For example, the Multi two diamonds, limited by the ACBL to midchart events, is played throughout the world. Players in the Netherlands believe that all unnatural bids (like Michaels) must be alerted.
 - In a team game, half the tables are "closed" and no kibitzing is allowed.
- In a Festival, the movement is apt to be a Howell so all can play each other.
- In the Netherlands and Belgium, a bridge pub/café crawl on a Saturday offers fee paying players an opportunity to move about six cafes, have a drink or lunch, play six to eight boards and assemble in a theater at end of day to learn the results. Anyone up for trying this in OTR or Covington's Mainstrasse?

Visiting Cuba was a terrific experience. The hotels and food were good. Our first two days overlapped with the final two days of the mourning period for Fidel Castro.

We saw a shrine in the hotel lobby; there was no music in the squares and there were many photos in the newspapers. We met Dr. Nkosazana Dlamini-Zuma, the first female chair of the African Union; she attended Castro's funeral. The

people were very welcoming; they have waited a long time for their neighbors to visit. I'd love to return and see more cities. My hope for 2017 is that the new administration continues President Obama's efforts to open Cuba to all of us.







New Life Master Jim Herchenroeder Enjoys All Competition—Both Coaching and Playing For All Ages!

I grew up in Kokomo, IN, eighth of ten kids. We played cards all the time and every game imaginable rummy, euchre, canasta, hearts, spades, Oh heck, sevens, blitz, poker... In summer, we would pull out Hoyle's and learn new games. Sunday night was pinochle night and the game was double deck, five-handed, ask-for-a-card as played by my dad in the Navy. One Sunday—I couldn't have been twelve years old yet—Mom announced that we were going to play bridge. St. Patrick's Church had started a class and she and Dad needed practice. My brother Mike -second of ten-was the fourth. Like we all did when we learned, we had print outs of how to count our points and what it took to open one spade. Mom bought Goren's Bridge Complete, and I read it cover to cover. I was hooked on bridge.

I was fourteen years old when I played in my first duplicate game. Dad didn't want to play duplicate so Mom drafted me as her partner. We won our first time out about 0.3 MP was all you got in those days, and we played for about a year before we moved on to other activities.

At Purdue University, I sought out its duplicate bridge club and became club president for all four years under the mentorship of Doris Hadley. I also studied for the director examination then, but never got around to taking the test. My regular partner was Deevi Pashaveeli, an Indian graduate student. His accent was very thick, and none of us could understand him except for his bids!

As often as I could—which was only a couple of times a month-Doris would drive me over to the Lafayette DBC where the serious players were. This group had some great players, but the only one I can remember was this dark haired lady named Meredith. Every time I went to her table, I learned a new way to get a bottom board. She was very, very good. Then one night, there was a big todo because a young man with bushy hair had come to play at the club—he wasn't more than five years older than me. Everyone was looking and whispering, and then finally somebody told me it was Eric Rodwell. He would have been fresh off one of his early NABC wins. Anyway, it turns out that Eric grew up in West Lafayette, was a Purdue graduate, AND his mother was Meredith Rodwell, the lady who taught me a lot although she never knew it. Eric has been my favorite professional since then, but I am sure that he has no memory of me at all!

I met my wife Laurie at Purdue in 1984, and we married in 1985 while I was attending graduate school at Iowa State. She has been my favorite partner in both bridge and life since then.

ISU didn't have a bridge club, but Laurie and I played three nights a week at the local clubs. I picked up those nonforcing strong two bids (ACOL style) we play from Betty, and I learned Precision and five card majors there as well,

giving up Goren at last. There was one lady, Ruth, who I particularly admired. She was a life master and an excellent player, and always polite and congenial. I loved the two or three times I got to partner her. But what I remember most from her was tempo. She waited the exact same few seconds for every bid and every play of the card. There was never a huddle or a long pause just as there were never any quick bids or play either. You absolutely never knew if she had her bid or not or whether she held that troublesome queen. I try to remember to keep that even tempo every time I sit down at the table.

During the ISU days, Laurie and I played in our first Regionals. We won a Flight B pairs game in Des Moines (our first red points!) and qualified for the Red Ribbon Pairs which led us to our first National in Anaheim. That Des Moines tournament was also the first time I successfully executed a squeeze at the table in a tournament. Our contract was 6NT and we got a top. By the time we left ISU in 1998, I had all the red points I needed to become a life master (but alas, no golds... and they had just invented silver). Bridge is so much fun, and winning is even more fun.

We combined bridge and vacations—seeing the sights during the day and playing bridge at night. Or sometimes bridge in the day and going out at night.

Then we took a twenty-five year vacation from bridge to have careers and to raise three daughters, only starting to play again three years ago. Although I had a hundred masterpoint head start on Laurie, she became Life Master ahead of me. However, we won all of our golds together which is nice. Coming in second in March at the Flight C GNP in 2015 in Reno was a definite highlight!!

I like playing and teaching in competitive games, and I guess that is why I like bridge so much. For example, I also used to be a competitive chess player (made the top one hundred in Indiana), and I coached Anderson Highland High School to the Indiana state championship in 1996. I ran a girls' softball league for seven years after moving from Gaston, IN to Harrodsburg ten years ago.


