

OU OPEN ONE spade with the South hand and LHO doubles. Partner decides to pass rather than bid 1NT. RHO bids 2C! Now, opposite a passed partner, it looks likely they have game so you bid a tactical 3S to make life hard on them. Tactical or semipreemptive as you don't expect partner to bid any more. LHO passes and your bid backfires as partner can't take a joke and now springs to life

and bids 4S. LHO leads a low spade trying to not give a trick away and who could blame him the way we bid?

Four Spades is an awful contract. We need to hold the Diamond losers to one and get the Ace of Hearts onside. After the takeout double, not likely. Nothing to do but win the Spade lead and continue the suit. LHO wins and RHO flags a big Club asking for that suit. LHO errs and shifts to the Jack of Clubs and a faint glimmer of hope appears. Do you see it?

I covered the J of Clubs with the Q and RHO plays the K, which must include the Ace of the suit, so I am certain the Ace of Hearts is offside. Moving quickly now, so they don't see what is coming, I ruff the Club King and pull the last trump, pitching a Club from dummy, and lead the Queen of Diamonds. LHO covers and we have some hope.

I win the Ace of Diamonds, ruff a Club back to hand and lead a low Diamond toward dummy. LHO bobbles a bit and then ducks. We are home.

I win the Diamond nine, ruff the last Club taking out LHO's last out card and now the third round of Diamonds end-plays LHO. He is down to all Hearts and has to let me score the King of Hearts!

West, as they say in baseball, got caught looking. He failed to see the danger of ducking the Diamond Jack.

What should have saved him? The familiar refrain of, COUNT DECLARER'S TRICKS! He knew I had six Spades tricks. I was void in Clubs, so even if he rose with the Diamond Jack and dropped his partner's Ten, I still would have had only nine tricks. Rising was a sure beat of the contract. Try counting declarer's tricks on defense. You will be amazed how the smoke clears on hands.

The Future of Bridge


After completing the Flying Pig Regional, A. J. Stephani provided a chart showing table count at District 11 and other nearby Regionals for the past 10.5 years. This is a sobering chart. Except for Crystal Lake, St. Louis, and Cincinnati, all Regionals are down versus the table count in 2007 versus the most recent Regional. Gatlinburg had 10,544 tables in 2007 versus 7,936 in 2017. Before claiming that the reduced Gatlinburg table count was attributable to the disastrous November 2016 Smoky Mountains/ Gatlinburg fire, look at the table count in 2016. It was 326 tables fewer than 2015.

What are our choices? First, let's recall what is the ACBL's mission:

The mission of the ACBL is to promote, grow and sustain the game of bridge and serve the bridge-related interests of our members.

What is the focus of Nationals, Regionals, Sectional, and most Club games? It is duplicate bridge. If we were to take a survey of many duplicate bridge players about how they started playing bridge, I think the most likely answers are:

- 1) I learned from my parents (or other relatives);
- 2) I started playing bridge at school;
- 3) There was a neighborhood party bridge game; or
- 4) My local church, synagogue, or mosque had a bridge night

My point is that it is more typical for bridge players to become interested in duplicate bridge rather than for players to start out as duplicate players.

If this premise is correct, then necessarily we need to think more about how to get more people playing bridge, not just duplicate bridge. How many of us know someone who likes playing cards, but does not enjoy the competitive nature of duplicate bridge? Some card players simply enjoy playing cards and are willing to have the luck of the draw determine how well they do. If the mission of the ACBL is to promote, grow, and sustain the game of bridge, then what ideas do we have about growing the game at the base level?

Inevitably, when you have a larger base of individuals playing bridge, there will be those interested in learning more about the game and how to play it better, allowing the luck of the draw and the skill of the player to determine outcome.

Is there hope for the future of bridge? Absolutely-bridge is too challenging of a game for it to fade away.

I was inspired by both an article by Rob Weidenfeld in the Cincinnati Bridge Association April 2017 ALERT, a quarterly newsletter and the 3rd Season of Fargo on FX.

Here is Rob's article:

BRIDGE MAXIMS DONT WORK AT THE PONDEROSA By Rob Weidenfeld

There was a time when you would have to say to a younger person that a certain TV program was before your time. No longer. With a thousand channels at everyone's disposal and all the recycled TV shows, everyone will know that the Ponderosa was the locale of Bonanza, the most popular TV show of its time. It featured the wise father Ben, the elder intellectual son Adam, the gargantuan Hoss, and the somewhat wild youngest son Little Joe. Adam had spent much time trying to acculturate his seemingly hopeless brethren. He tried reading them poetry, playing ballads on his guitar, and as a last resort, bridge. He was lecturing them one evening on why bridge maxims were so important. "In order to achieve a degree of competence in this game," he said with the wisdom of the eldest, "you must apply knowledge that has a time-proven value. Such notions as "eight ever, nine never", "when in doubt, draw trump", and "second hand low" are there for a reason. They have been learned after years of practice and should never be ignored," he continued sounding a bit this side of pompous.





If Ben had any queen seven was laydown. If he had length in any side suit, seven had to have a good play. Little Joe led the ♦Q and this is what Adam saw:




Adam surveyed the dummy and was not displeased. No extra honors, but ♥ length which would allow a ♦ discard if ♥ were 3-3 or if Little Joe had a doubleton ten or queen. Pretty straightforward he assessed.

He won the lead in hand, rapidly led three rounds of trumps while Little Joe discarded a small ♠, and then played the ♥K and then ♥J. Joe followed small to the first but played the ♥10 under the ♥J. "That's all I need gentleman," Adam declared confidently as he won the \(\forall A\) in dummy. Knowing that Joe could not

have the ♥queen-ten and not cover, he played the ♥9. If Hoss played the ♥Q he would ruff and get back to dummy with the ♣A and pitch a losing ♦ on the good ♥. When Hoss followed small he pitched his losing ♦ and claimed making seven. His Cheshire grin quickly dissipated when Joe produced the VQ and said, "Down One." "I can't believe that you didn't cover the ♥I when you were only left with the ♥QT," bemoaned Adam finding this loss to his clearly inferior brother hard to swallow.

Here was the full hand:



"You forgot to mention one of the maxims, big brother," said Little Joe with the Cheshire grin that he had just stolen from Adam. "Always cover an honor with an honor is one of the silliest ideas you ever tried to teach me," he declared triumphantly. And bridge was never again the same at the Ponderosa.

Fargo on FX

A recent "Fresh Air" NPR broadcast featured "Fargo." This FX series, based on the 1996 film by Joel and Ethan Coen, is now in its third season. The first season was nominated for 18 Emmy Awards. The Fresh Air guest was the series creator, Noah Hawley.

The 1st episode of Season Three is entitled "The Law of Vacant Places" and features a regional bridge tournament. Ray Stussy (Ewan

McGregor) is a parole officer dating a recent parolee, the alluring Nikki Swango (Mary Elizabeth Winstead). She is a competitive bridge player and urges him to join her in a regional tournament as a way to earn some quick cash. For research, the actors attended a bridge tournament in Calgary, Alberta, and actual players were used as extras in the bridge-playing scenes. "It's the first time in history bridge has looked sexy," McGregor jokes. "Noah Hawley has achieved the unachievable."

Here were comments by Noah Hawley on the game of bridge:

But the more I looked at the game of Bridge, the more fascinating it became because it really is a hugely complicated game that touches on elements of quantum mechanics. And there are 58 octillion possible deals and all of these very—you know, that she refers to the Murray Appelbaum discovery play. The language of Bridge is really fascinating and fun as well. And I wanted the sense that Nikki, that Mary Winstead's character, is really the brains of the operation and that she's a strategist. And Bridge is a huge game for strategy.

(As a footnote, Noah Hawley did not look at bridge closely enough. The number of hands is 53.6 octillion—more precisely, 53,644,737,765,488,792,839, 237,440,000. See Bridge Odds for Practical Players by Hugh Kelsey and Michael Glauert.)

Why am I encouraged by Bonanza and Fargo?

When bridge is part of popular culture, it generates interest. When a favorite TV series and a well-received mini-series both have serious bridge hands or games, there will be people who will begin to express interest in learning bridge. Our challenge is whether we will have the creative ideas, volunteers, and strategy to engage these wannabe bridge players.







RAD WALDEN ACHIEVES Gold Life Master—with research and notes Growing up in a bridge playing family, I learned a bit just by observation. In college, after lunch, a few of us set up a table for a one hour break between classes. I never heard of duplicate bridge and the only convention I knew was Blackwood. Then came marriage, followed by a tour in the Army and graduate school, preparing for ministry. During those years I had no time for bridge. When I retired from an active ministry in 2004, I was eager to get back to bridge. My wife had no interest, so I found the Bridge Center of Lexington and invited myself in to observe.

The director at that first visit was an experienced player, Sandra Marlin. She began asking questions: "How many master points do you have? Do you play Standard American, 2/1?" I never had heard any such terms. After a few more questions, she said, "I know how you play. Just stay and play and I will be your partner to make an even number of pairs." Throughout the session, I continued to speak my bids aloud and play each card in the center of the table. Gradually, I learned the routine and had some fun. Sandra said, "We came in first." So I was hooked and began taking classes, studying books, plus playing online.

Much of my learning has come informally at the club from partners. The members of the club are always helpful. Their attitude is not: How can I beat you, but how can I help you expand your game. I took Anita Pettus' class for beginners and Carol Fox's class on defense. That introduced me to Audrey Grant's series of books, twenty-five bridge conventions you should know and then twenty-five more bridge conventions. I love the Marty Bergen books, too.

I kept a notebook, three ring binder for my notes which I could download after a Google search Very handy. So you want to learn Jacoby 2NT? Splinters? etc. etc. Just Google it. Tournaments? I have gone to several over time. Fun... but exhausting.

I was born in Ahmedabad, India and may be a result of my parents' mistake as my brother and were eighteen and twenty years older than I. . Growing up, I played many card games: hearts, spades and rook; I also played chess as well as other games in India that are not played in the United States. We played twice and then tried playing in a Lexington sectional tournament and won the open pair section with eightytwo tables which in 1984, was not stratified. Competing and winning peaked my interest and we started playing once a week at the bridge club. Suddenly, I knew I loved


